The husband felt they were on the right path now with a new doctor as her health is returning, but the medical bills and co-pays had been draining all their income. They had resorted to selling some belongings to try to make up for the expenses, but this had not been enough to prevent the risk of eviction or utility disconnection.

I went through their budget and expenses thoroughly. We put together a plan to get them back on track which included three months rent, gift cards for food and gas, and a payment on their utility bill that would bring it up to date. After reviewing the quote for his car repairs, we approved those as well and sent him to our trusted mechanics that would complete the work for less.

The father hugged me when I shared the assistance we would provide, and he tried his best to hide his tears of relief from his children but the youngest noticed and came up to ask, "Why

are you crying Daddy?" He answered, "Because Daddy prayed for a helping hand and God answered my prayers." His child may not have understood his reply, but I did and I know you do too. I thank you for your generosity to our charity that allows us to provide tears of relief to so many in our communities.
